Joseph - From Pit to Palace

Genesis 37:1-36; Genesis 39:1-23; Genesis 50:15-21

Into the Pit - Genesis 37:1-23

- Joseph was his father's favorite
- God has a plan for Joseph
- The brothers' plan for Joseph

From Pit to Potiphar's House Genesis 37:25-36

- Joseph is sold into slavery
 - Joseph is saved from death but is instead placed into slavery
- God is working, even in the difficult times

From Potiphar's House to Prison -Genesis 39:1-23

- God blesses Joseph where he is
- Joseph is falsely accused of attempted rape by Potiphar's wife
- Joseph holds on to his integrity

From Prison to Promotion Genesis 39:20-23; Genesis 41:14-16, 39-44

- Joseph is sent to prison on the false charge
 - Joseph remains faithful
- Even in prison, God continues to bless Joseph
- God uses dreams and visions

From Persecution to Pardon Genesis 50:15-21

- The brothers come to Joseph for salvation from famine and death
- The brothers fear Joseph's wrath, but Joseph extends forgiveness
- Joseph's forgiveness allows for the restoration of his relationships with his brothers

Joseph as a Type of Christ

- Joseph was falsely accused, persecuted, and punished
 - Jesus was also falsely accused, persecuted and punished
- Joseph suffered at the hands of those he loved
 - Jesus also suffered at the hands of his people
- God brought redemption to Joseph
 - God brought redemption to the world through Jesus
- Joseph showed grace and forgiveness to his brothers though they did not deserve it
 - Jesus showed grace and forgiveness at the cross for all of us, though we did not deserve it

What Does it Mean?

- Trust God in difficult times
- Forgive those who ask for it, for this is how relationships are restored
- Faithfulness and integrity are critical traits for Christians
- God has a plan
