The Call of Abraham

- Abraham's journey of faith teaches us several important lessons.
 - Obedience to God's call often requires us to step out of our comfort zones, trusting in His plan even when it seems uncertain.
 - <u>Faith</u> in God's promises leads to righteousness, not our own efforts or achievements.
 - God's covenants are unwavering and unconditional, grounded in His character and faithfulness.

The Abrahamic Covenant

- The Covenant consists of three promises:
 - Land
 - Descendants
 - Blessing

The Abrahamic Covenant

- God's Promises to Abraham:
 - They are unconditional
 - They are eternal
 - They are grounded in God's unchanging character and faithfulness.

What Does it Mean?

- Faith and obedience are necessary to respond to God's call.
- Sometimes, God calls us out of our comfort zones to follow Him, to trust Him, and to walk by faith, not by sight.
- Despite the challenges and uncertainties, remain faithful, trusting that God will fulfill His promises.
- God deepens our faith.

What Does it Mean?

- It's not our works or our efforts that make us righteous in God's eyes, but our faith in Him.
- God's covenants are unwavering and unconditional, grounded in His character and faithfulness.
- God is faithful
- God is sovereign
